- 1. Introduction. The following notices are intended to assist buyers, particularly those that are new to our saleroom and internet bidding platforms. Our auctions are governed by our Terms and Conditions of Business incorporating the Terms of Consignment, the Terms of Sale supplemented by any notices that are displayed in our saleroom, the online catalogue listing or announced by the auctioneer at the auction. Our Terms and Conditions of Business are available for inspection at our saleroom and online at www.forumauctions.co.uk. Our staff will be happy to help you with any questions you may have regarding our Terms and Conditions of Business. Please make sure that you read our Terms of Sale set out in this catalogue and on our website carefully before bidding in the auction. In registering to bid with us you are committing to be bound by our Terms of Sale.
- Agency. As auctioneers we usually act on behalf of the seller whose identity, for reasons of confidentiality, is not normally disclosed. If you buy at auction your contract for the goods is with the seller, not with us as auctioneer.
- 3. Estimates. Estimates are intended to indicate the hammer price that a particular lot may achieve. The lower estimate may represent the reserve price (the minimum price for which a lot may be sold) and cannot be below the reserve price. Estimates do not include the buyer's premium, VAT or other taxes and fees (where chargeable). Estimates may be altered by a saleroom notice.
- 4. Buyer's Premium. The Terms of Sale oblige you to pay a buyer's premium on the hammer price of each lot purchased. All lots are offered under the Auctioneer's Margin Scheme and VAT (at 20%) is included within the buyer's premium. Buyer's premium is charged per lot at 26% of the hammer price (31.2% including VAT) up to and including £20,000, 25% (30% including VAT) of the hammer price from £20,001 up to and including £500,000, 20% (24% including VAT) of the hammer price from £500,001 up to and including £1,000,000, and 12.5% of the hammer price (15% including VAT) in excess of £1,000,001. We are happy to make the submission of necessary applications on behalf of our buyers but we will charge for this service only to cover the costs of our time.
- 8. Bidding. Bidders will be required to register with us before bidding. Purchases will be invoiced to the buyer's registered name and address only. When first registering for an account with us you will need to provide us with proof of your identity in a form acceptable to us. - 9. Commission bidding. You may leave commission bids with us indicating the maximum amount (excluding the buyer's premium and/or any applicable VAT, fees or other taxes) you authorise us to bid on your behalf for a lot. We will execute commission bids at the lowest price possible having regard only to the reserve and other competing bids on the lot. Please note that we accept commission bids at standard bidding increments and reserve the right to reduce an off-increment bid down to the next lowest bidding increment or otherwise at our sole discretion.
- 10. Live online bidding. When using our BidFORUM platform to participate in the auction through your account on our website there will be no additional charges. If you are using a third party live bidding platform then additional fees may be applicable. We will invoice these to you as an additional service and any applicable VAT will be separated out.

\* Fortescue had been appointed Chief Justice of the king's bench in 1442, but after Henry VI was deposed, and the Duke of York's son proclaimed himself King Edward IV, he accompanied Queen Margaret and Henry's son, the Prince of Wales, abroad, where he devoted himself to the education of the young prince, and where he wrote De Laudibus legum Angliae for his instruction c.1470. It was first published in about 1537 abroad, and this is the first English translation, by Robert Mulcaster, the great Elizabethan educationalist. It is written in the form of a friendly dialogue between Fortescue and the Prince, which Coke described as worthy "of being written in letters of gold."







Sir William Stanley served under the Earl of Leicester in the Netherlands during the Wars of Religion. His regiment took the town of Deventer in October 1586 from the Spanish and Stanley was put in charge as governor, then in January 1587 he defected and handed the town back to the Spanish. He became acquainted with William Allen who published a defence of his actions at Deventer, which is the text being repudiated in the present work.

A curious assembly of tracts, mostly of a religious flavour. Wright (fl. 1591) was a religious controversialist who advocated the cause of prelacy in this work, subtitled "A briefe description of the Church of Rome from the time of Antichrist until our present age." The Faust legend was first published in English around 1590 and was so popular that numerous subsequent editions appeared. Warner (1581-1666), bishop of Rochester and chaplain to Charles I, was a staunch adherent of established church and monarchy against puritans and parliamentarians. This sermon was preached and published anonymously within a week of the execution of the king and inveighs against the regicides, treating the king as a personification of Christ. The "Alarme" is a call to repentance. The final pamphlet, apparently not in Wing, describes a meeting to assess the rates for the payment of troops and to appoint commissioners for each of the hundreds in the district round Lancashire.





\* Scarce and important Early History of the Russian Empire. Fletcher (c.1548-1611) was a poet and diplomat who was sent as an ambassador to Russia in 1588 to re-establish a treaty with Tsar Feodor I, essentially for the benefit of trade. This account which covers much about the country and its people was written on his return and borrows at least in part from other writers such as Herberstein and the accounts of English merchants.

A notorious work which earned the author the soubriquet "Century White". The work is a justification of the removal from their livings by the Puritans (on the pretext of drunkenness, immorality and other crimes and sins) of a number of the clergy who had marked themselves out by their royalism. Page 4 includes reference to Lawrence Washington, the great-greatgrandfather of George Washington, the first American president. Washington was at the time rector at Purleigh in Essex and is here accused of being "a common frequenter of Ale-houses". Following his removal from Purleigh, he became rector of Little Braxted and the subsequent poverty of the family led to Lawrence's son John (1633-77) going to sea as a sailor and ultimately led to his settling in Virginia.







He eulogises his royalist friends such as the Earls of Northampton, Viscount Falkland, Sir C. Cavendish, the poet Francis Quarles, the Earl of Chesterfield's sons and Sir W. Wentworth with energetic verse. The Huth copy is apparently the only one known with the errata leaf present. Apart from the Huth copy, which has appeared twice since 1988, the last copy at auction was in 1985.

A royalist, he was saved from hanging by the Parliamentarians by Ashmole's intervention, and after the Restoration he was appointed royal treasurer and paymaster and created a baronet. His works include essays on astrology and chronology, astrological explanations of political events, and a translation of Rothman's chiromancy. He got himself embroiled in political and professional controversies with Lilly and Booker by invariably predicting victory for the monarchists and admonishing the rebels to submit. This work was written during a visit to Yorkshire in September 1646.







Her first prophecies, published in 1633 in Holland and reissued here in verse form, led to a fine of £3000 and imprisonment for seven years, first in Bedlam and then in the Tower. The last of her works was published in 1652. The reason for her imprisonment is made clear by the side-notes - she prophesied the death of Charles I and the end of the monarchy in England.

Porter, also injured, had to leave the country but a court later found the cause of death unknown.

  - 20.2.3 if sent by pre-paid airmail, 5 Business Days after posting, exclusive of the day of posting; or
